Leading Pedagogy

This week, Mrs Dance and myself attended a Professional Learning program at the CEWA office in Geraldton. This program will involve us engaging as learners in order to lead and guide the staff in the development of a project throughout the year that will support our students in their learning. The focus of this project, known as a spiral of inquiry, will focus on ways that we collect, analyse and reflect on data in order to enhance student engagement and improvement in the curriculum area of Mathematics. We will continue to keep you informed of this project throughout the year through the newsletter, Facebook posts and Seesaw messages.

Early Years Conference

This Thursday, Friday and Saturday, Miss Bec Hartwell, our Kindy teacher, Miss Joanne Carlos, our Pre-Primary teacher and Mrs Courtney Russell, our Year One teacher are all travelling to Perth to attend the National Early Years Conference. The Early Years Conference will allow staff to explore best practices for our youngest student's development and learning. They are looking forward to hearing from Dr Jane Merewether (PhD), a Senior Lecturer in Early Childhood and Indigenous/Cultural Studies in the School of Education at Murdoch University, plus many more leaders in the Early Childhood space. We look forward to hearing about their learning and to see how they implement it in our early childhood classrooms.

Digital Technologies Professional Learning

We thank you for allowing us to develop our learning as a whole staff, during this week's Student Free Day. Staff explored the use of iPads in the classroom to improve student learning and engagement. Staff also explored how to use Seesaw as a tool for communication about student learning between the school and home environment and focused on using technology as a tool, to cater for individual learning needs, be that support or extension. We look forward to seeing how teachers will use their learning in their teaching and learning programs.

Student Attendance
